## PASTOR'S COLUMN



I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." >>

~ Isaiah 43:19

Naaman was a man of power. He came to Elisha with all his might, his armies and his gold and silver to see if the prophet could cure him of his

leprosy. Naaman was a man of the world. He knew what the world, in its shadowy power, could do. He knew he could buy just about anything. Naaman knew what the world could do. He knew his body was rotting from a fearsome and fatal disease. Naaman came to the prophet Elisha knowing both sides of the world.

Elisha knew what the world could do, too. He knew the law in Leviticus prohibiting contact with a leper. But he also knew what God could do. Elisha did not meet Naaman's wealth and power. Elisha simply met Naaman with the Word of God which overcomes the world. This word made Naaman angry. He couldn't understand something that didn't involve the world's power. Yet, through the common sense, "it-can't-hurt" words of his servants, Naaman heeded the Word of God through Elisha. Naaman washed seven times in the Jordan, and was made clean. God's Word washed him beyond the healing of his disease. God made him all new, a fresh child, scrubbed and clean as though he had just come from a bath by his mother.

A Leper also came to Jesus. Probably he wasn't rich and powerful like Naaman. Probably he knew only the life

of the outcast and the desperation of disease. From his place in the world's weakness, he reached out for the Word which Naaman couldn't hear: The Word of God with the power to heal. Jesus touched him and said, "Be clean." Jesus' Word was even more powerful than Elisha's. it asked no seven-fold dip in the waters of the Jordan. Jesus' Word itself was washing enough. Jesus brought a new Word from God, a Word which washes over bodies, heart and minds and makes them clean, clean like babies straight from their mothers' baths.


Whenever we celebrate a baptism on our congregation, we are all brought once again into the cleansing power of God's Word. The water poured over the person baptized drowns us all anew in its healing flood. The Naamans of this world and the outcasts of this world all stand beneath the same great waterfall of grace and forgiveness. The powerful and the weak, the articulate and not-so-articulate, the rich and the poor, we are all one in our need for cleansing and rebirth. We are together in our need to be scrubbed clean by the power of



God's Word at work within us.

Jesus is for us both the water and the Word. He promises that we will be people of living water; we are made clean. In John's gospel, Jesus tells his disciples, "You are already made clean by the Word which I have spoken to you." (John 15:3) Already made clean! What a wonderful world! We are created in new flesh as God's children, forgiven, restored and renewed for life.

Jesus' power to speak the washing cleansing Word finds its fulfillment in the cross. There, suffering in our humanity, Jesus accomplishes the work which brings health and wholeness to the whole world. Through this sordid, dirty, messy death, the whole world is brought to the place of healing and beauty with cleansed hearts and minds. We who were outcasts are now brought into the household for the feast. We who saw the rotting side of the world are healed of our disease and made ready to join the banquet. Jesus says, "You are already made clean by the Word which I have spoken to you." Just as a mother reminds us that we are already washed in the death of Jesus and ready for the feast. Naaman's power is of no avail. The law's restrictions do not bind. The leper sits next to him at the table. We all join with them in the feast of those who have been made clean in the living water which is God's Word in Jesus. R

### VALENTINE'S DAY IS A DAY OF CARING FOR OTHERS

Valentine's Day often reminds us of the importance of expressing love to those closest to us. However, as children of God, we are called to extend care and compassion beyond a single day or select group of people. The Bible is rich with teachings about love, kindness, and serving others, guiding us to reflect God's love in all our interactions such as:

• Jesus said: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself" ~ Matthew 22:37-39, NIV. This teaching emphasizes that caring for others is central to our faith.

• Paul writes in Galatians 6:2, "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way, you will fulfill the law of Christ." This verse reminds us to step into others' struggles and offer support through prayer, encouragement, or tangible help.

• Jesus modeled perfect love, healing the sick, feeding the hungry, and spending time with the marginalized. In John 13:34-35, He commands us: "Love one another. As I have loved you, you must love one another. By this, everyone will know that you are my disciples."

#### Here are Some Tips for Sharing God's Love:

• Pray for Others Prayer is powerful. Take time to pray for friends, family, and strangers. Ask God to meet their needs and reveal His love to them.

• Speak Words of Encouragement Proverbs 16:24 says, "Gracious words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones." A kind word can brighten someone's day and remind them of their value in God's eyes.

• Be Present In a world full of distractions, giving undivided attention can be profound. Listen actively and show empathy to those who need a friend.



• Share the Gospel The ultimate way to show care is to share the good

news of Jesus Christ. Let others see the hope and joy that comes from a relationship with Him (1 Peter 3:15).

• Extend Forgiveness Ephesians 4:32 reminds us: "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." Forgiveness reflects God's grace.

• Give Generously Giving your time, resources, or talents demonstrates God's love. As 2 Corinthians 9:7 says, "God loves a cheerful giver."

Caring for others as a child of God is a lifestyle rooted in love and selflessness. By following Jesus' example and living out biblical principles, we can touch hearts and glorify God. This Valentine's Day — and every day — let us commit to showing God's love to everyone, being His hands and feet in a world that needs His light.  $\mathbf{R}$

Dear Friends in Christ:


We often talk about being called to be stewards of God's love. By definition a steward is a manager, but is that really the

## **ZLCW ANNUAL REPORT UPDATE**

ZLCW Secretary has expressed concern the full ZLCW report was not included in the Annual Report. As the Women of Zion play a vital role in serving our church, community, and beyond, they request that the complete report be shared to ensure all members are informed.

Zion Lutheran Church Women have been busy serving others in 2024. Some of their activities included:

• Collected Personal Care Kit items and made 63 kits sent to Lutheran World Relief (LWR) October 2024

• In lieu of a Salad Supper in the fall, it was decided to have a Silent Auction April 13-21, 2024, as a fundraiser for end of year benevolences. It was very successful and a second Silent Auction was held November 16-24, 2024. This was also successful.

• Donated a quilt to Shawano-Menominee American Cancer Society Relay for Life.

• Donated a quilt to the Shawano County Historical Society Rhubarb Festival in June.

• With the help of Zion members School Kit supplies were collected and 50 School Kits were sent to LWR in October 2024.

• Quilts were given to six Zion high school seniors in May 2024.

• Throughout the year Wee Care volunteers used the kitchen to bake cookies as a fund raiser to purchase food for lunches given to students.

• Funeral meals were served by ZLCW and the food catered from Charlie's.

• Festival of Trees was held at Zion in December. There was approximately a dozen decorated trees throughout the Commons. They added much to the area throughout the Christmas season!

• A monthly Bible Study group meets at 3:30 p.m. October through April and at 6:30 p.m. May through September the third Monday of each month in Zion's library. The group uses the Bible Study in the Gather magazine, a publication of the ELCA. Join us for fellowship and to learn more about the Bible.

• Zion's Mission Quilters made a total of 204 quilts, 63 Personal Care Kits, and 50 School Kits from October 2023 to October 2024. These items were sent to the LWR warehouse in Minneapolis. Zion's confirmation students brought the boxes upstairs to the long hallway, taped them shut, and stacked them in the east entryway for easy loading into Mike Eidahl's truck, Diane Rugalski's van, and Dorothy Eidahl's van. It was wonderful to see what the Mission Quilter's and Zion members did for others.

• At the December ZLCW meeting, the Executive Board decided where to donate monies (see ZLCW Treasurer's

Report) to support various charities in Shawano, Zion and the world. Thank you for your support throughout the year. Without your support we could not share these benevolences.

• Throughout the year Zion's Mission Quilters were gifted with monetary and fabric donations from Zion members and the community. This means so much to us and is vital to the success of this dedicated group of women. Anyone is welcome to join us! You do not need to know how to sew! We meet every Tuesday morning at 9:00 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall. It is a time of making new friends, fellowship, and doing something for others.

• Zion's Mission Quilters are always in need of fabric donations, blankets, twin/queen/king sheets and monetary donations used to purchase batting to put between the layers of fabric. (We cannot use fabric that is camouflage, fleece, Christmas, netting, slippery fabric or military.) The items should be clean. Dark colors work best, but light colors are also used for middles in place of batting. Please consider Zion's Mission Quilters if you have or know of someone who no longer needs their fabric.

• In February 2024 a new ZLCW handbook will be printed. If you no longer have a land line telephone and use only a cell phone, please contact Karen Childs at 715.526.2445 or Dorothy Eidahl at 715.526.2650 with your cell phone number. We want to include everyone in the handbook with correct information.

Did you know each confirmed woman of Zion is a member of ZLCW? It is incredible knowing that, together, we can serve others through various activities here and in the community. We can walk together in our faith journey, no matter where we are in that journey. And, we can help others at Zion, in our community and in the world.

Please prayerfully consider joining ZLCW and sharing your talents in 2025 and all ZLCW does for Zion, Shawano and the world.





Make this heartfelt craft as a decoration or gift. What you need: • Yarn Scissors • Parchment paper • Baking sheet • Heart-shaped cookie cutters • ¼ cup cornstarch • ½ cup water • Adult help

#### What you do:

- 1. Cut yarn into 12-inch pieces.
- 2. Place cookie cutters atop a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- 3. Combine cornstarch and water in a saucepan. Heat mixture over medium heat, stirring until thick and smooth. Remove from heat and cool to form a "glue."
- 4. Dip each piece of yarn into the mixture to coat completely. Squeeze off any excess.
- 5. Place yarn in the cookie cutters, allowing pieces to cross and loop within the heart. Add more until the cookie cutter is filled and the yarn looks like a heart.
- 6. Remove cookie cutters and bake the sheet for two hours at 150°F, or until hearts are dry and hard.


